- 2. This Order applies to Frome Victoria Park between the hours of 10am and 6:30pm during the period from 1 April until 30 September

A person in charge of a dog shall be guilty of an offence if, on any land to which this Order applies he does not keep the dog on a lead of not more than 2 metres in length during the times specified, unless-
