1. Community Development: One Year Service Contract from June 2015

The MCA is a new Community Association. The work will include:

- Developing the membership of the Association.
- Publicity and promotion, organisation of outreach events across our area of benefit.
- Developing and promoting the Key Centre as a focus for healthy living activity.
- Engaging volunteers and the local community in the creation of healthy environments and in supporting healthy living activities.
- Increasing capacity to deliver services in the community through volunteer engagement, support and training.
- Developing the capacity of the organisation in terms of a sustainable business model and strong governance.
- Collating evidence to demonstrate service needs and that can also be used to support future funding bids and service development.
- Assistance with preparation of funding bids that will build build sustainable and extended activities.

You will need to be self-employed with a track record in business management and community engagement/development. The service contract is flexible, deliverable by a suitably skilled individual who may employ others to assist delivery. You will work in association with MCA staff and nominated Trustees. The budget for staff and subcontractors

is £10,400 with additional funds available for resources. Payment will be judged on achieving results against outcomes that will be detailed in the contract.

This role is for someone who is fully committed and enthusiastic about enabling communities to become more connected, resilient and healthy.

2. Communities Administrator/Manager

10 hours per week (afternoons), based at the Key Centre, BA11 5AJ. Must be available during 80% of school holidays. A varied job, including administration for the Association, oversight of small projects (including monitoring and preparing funder reports), some basic book keeping, assisting with development of MCA policies and procedures, publicity, projects oversight, volunteer support and organising volunteer training and meeting/greeting Community Centre Users. You must be enthusiastic, well organised, numerate, a good communicator and able to use standard computing packages such as spreadsheets, databases and wordprocessing. This job is situated in a childrens' centre and the successful applicant will need to adhere to strict rules of confidentiality.
