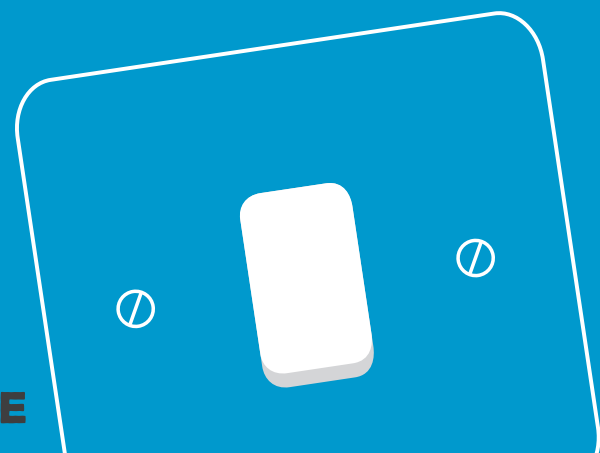

Professor Keith Barnham

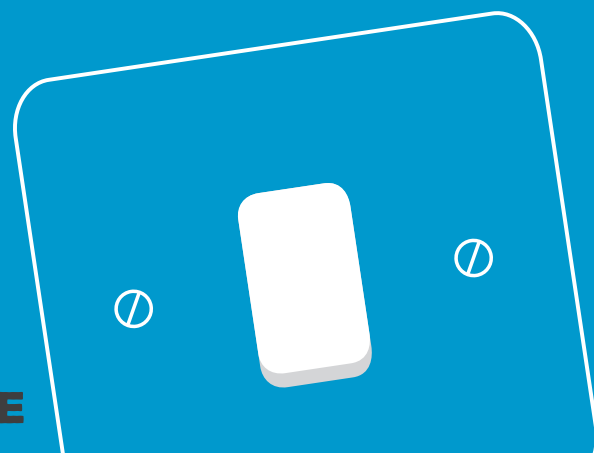

Professor Axel Goodbody

Professor Axel Goodbody is a founding member of the British branch of the Association for the Study of Literature and Environment and of the European Association for the Study of Literature, Culture and Environment. He graduated from Trinity College Dublin and spent ten years teaching and studying in Germany, at the University of Kiel, before moving to Bath. Climate change fiction and nature writing are focuses of his current work. He co-edits the journal ECOZON@ and the book series Nature, Culture and Literature and New Studies in European Cinema. He was Research Fellow at the Rachel Carson Center for Environment and Society in Munich in 2015. He is currently CI on the three-year AHRC project, Stories of Change: Energy in the past, present and future. He is a lecturer at Bath University.
