## Agenda item 5

For decision – Management & Improvement Plans for Rodden Meadow and Millennium Green

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#### Summary

This report presents the new Management & Improvement Plans for Rodden Meadow and Millennium Green.

These plans will replace the previous (joint) plan, which was discussed and approved by the Council Matters committee in autumn 2017.

The new plans are scheduled to be reviewed in another year's time (Spring into Summer 2020)

Given how close the spaces are – and the natural overlaps in their management and upkeep – the plans will be reviewed together.

## Background

We have plans for the management and improvement of all the parks and green spaces that we look after. These plans are discussed and then formally approved by the Council Matters committee. Depending on a number of factors, the plans are then reviewed every year, every 18 months, or every other year.

By design, the format of our plans is repeated across all the parks and green spaces that we look after. The plans include important details like the main habitat typology; and a management summary.

The plans aren't intended to be daunting or overly technical. Rather, we hope that our plans are concise, straightforward and engaging - and that they make people want to head outdoors to explore the town's parks and green spaces.

## Previously

The old (outgoing) plan for Rodden Meadow and Millennium Green was discussed and approved by the Council Matters Committee in June 2017. This was a joint plan, combining both spaces.

This is being replaced with two new plans: one for each space. These are at <u>Appendix 5.1</u> (Rodden Meadow) and <u>Appendix 5.2</u> (Millennium Green).

## Next steps

Our plans are often ambitious, and this means that we don't always manage to deliver all of the next steps within the review schedule of the plan.

With reference to the old plan, the following table identifies what we've done at Rodden Meadow and Millennium Green in the last couple of years. It also identifies the things that we haven't managed to do just yet.
