


Why Resilience?

- We need to reduce from a three planet life style
- One Planet Living is part of our Neighbourhood Plan
- Flooding, fuel poverty, air quality
- We spend £13m on energy in Frome
- Going 'zero carbon' could create 840 jobs and generate £42m for the local economy
- Resilience post costs 16p per household per month IFFs raised precept 25% then 17%
- Zero carbon Zero waste Sustainable transport 3 Sustainable materials 4 Local and sustainable food Sustainable water 6 Land and wildlife Culture and heritage 8 Equity and local economy 9 Health and happiness


Flooding

- Met Office: sea levels may rise by 1 meter at Bristol Channel by 2070. 5.4°C hotter in summer 4.2°C in winter.
- Summer rainfall could decrease by 47% and increase by 35% in winter.









- Linked with <u>CSE</u> in Bristol to train volunteers to help fuel poor households.
- Run regular energy advice cafes over winter. Promote CSE's free home energy helpline: 0800 082 2234
- Link with <u>Evolve</u> to promote free and discounted insulation offers
- Co-ran two <u>Open Homes events</u>, attended by 600 people
- Lend thermal imaging camera to residents to see where their home is leaking heat







- Annual <u>Improve Don't Move</u> event showcasing local eco architects, carpenters, landscapers, energy advice including a <u>green directory</u>
- Regular talks around energy and climate change e.g. Nikki Jones and Dr Aaron Thierry
- Thematic twinning event 'Switch to a renewable future' attended by 600 people



- Supported <u>Frome Renewable Energy Co-op</u> who raised £280,000 in <u>community shares</u> in three days to put 150kw of solar on Frome Medical Practice and 50kw of solar on Frome Football Club
- Lobbying Somerset District Council to divest their pension fund which currently invests £125million in fossil fuels, including almost £70million in fracking, FB group here
- Regular meetings with other towns, parishes, experts from <u>CAT</u> and others to explore how to go zero carbon





- <u>Solar streets:</u> discounted solar offer for Frome residents, saving an average of £1500 per install. 70 homes installed in first three months
- <u>Energy sparks</u> excellent free website which links schools with their energy data. Includes curriculum linked activities.





- Saxonvale exploring feasibility of setting up a community owned microgrid and zero carbon heat network for large development site in Frome with <u>Microgrid Foundry</u>.
- Somerset Community Energy setting up an umbrella organisation to scale up community energy projects in the area
- Free solar for business working with <u>Green Nation</u> to offer a flexible free solar offer to local businesses



Transport

- Developed sustainable <u>transport</u> <u>strategy</u>
- Annual school <u>Active Travel Challenge</u> with 2000 pupils.
- Two electric bikes available for hire using <u>bike rental manager</u>
- Five free electric charge points installed via **Zero Carbon World**
- Linking with <u>Book My Charge</u> to enable domestic charge points to be shared



Transport

- Secured funding from DfT to enable social enterprise <u>Co-Wheels</u> to offer affordable hybrid car club.
- Work with Frome and Village Bus User Group, First Great Western and others to lobby for better bus and train services
- Set up Frome's Volunteer Driver Scheme





Resources

- Worked with <u>Edventure Frome CIC</u> to set up the UK's first Library of Things: <u>SHARE</u>
- SHARE saves the community £62,000 a year, 92 tonnes of greenhouse gases and 127 tonnes of materials and waste.





Resources

- Worked with <u>Edventure Frome CIC</u> to set up the UK's first <u>Community Fridge</u>, there are now more than 70 in the UK
- The fridge enables over 90,000 items a year to be enjoyed rather than be thrown away. This saves 140 tonnes of greenhouse gases, equivalent to driving 340,000 miles.
- <u>Hubub's community fridge network</u> can support others in setting up a fridge





Resources

- Support others such as the Toy Library and the Happy Nappy (cloth nappy) library
- Eliminated single use plastic at the council. Working with the community and businesses to reduce plastic and achieve <u>SAS's plastic free community</u> status
- Worked with <u>Protomax</u> to recycle VHS tapes and create recycled plastic noticeboards

Public meetings / climate panels due in November 2019, climate emergency plan published Jan 2020

Working group currently being set up





Other activities

Good Business Framework:

monthly visits to local businesses to promote and support environmental, social and economic best practice

Fundraising:

£900,000 secured in five years through external grants and community shares





Whatcombe fields, 32 acres saved by the local community using community shares
