Impossible choices

- What if you have the heating on?
 - Warmth
 - Higher costs –risk of debt
 - Lower spend on other things
 - Stress and anxiety
 - Potential health impacts
- What if you don't?
 - Saves money
 - Cold home - risk of damp
 - Coping behaviours
 - Stress and anxiety
 - Significant health impacts



Clear solutions

- **Income:** Income maximisation, including Warm Home Discount
- **Property:** Energy efficiency improvements; better controls
- **Energy prices:** Switching tariff or supplier; group buying
- **Need for energy:** Energy literacy and behaviour change
