For information - The next stage of Green and Healthy Frome

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Summary

The Green and Healthy Frome partnership has recently been successful in securing further funding from the National Lottery's Climate Action Fund to accelerate health and climate action in Frome. The partners - Edventure Frome, Frome Medical Practice and Frome Town Council - have been awarded just under $\pounds_{1.7}$ million over three years to expand and deliver a number of pioneering projects which promote people's health and wellbeing, whilst also reducing carbon emissions.

This report informs Council of receiving the Lottery Grant and outlines the development stage to date and the pans for the future.

1. A Green and Healthy Frome

Green & Healthy Frome is a project developed through the National Lottery's Climate Action Fund to explore the relationship between positive action on climate change, and our own health and wellbeing. It is inspired by a vision of Frome as a town of happy and healthy citizens, taking action together to reduce carbon emissions and create a better future for our town. It brings together Frome Town Council, Frome Medical Practice and Edventure in a unique and powerful partnership, building a town-wide movement around climate and health win-wins.

Despite the devastating impact of climate change becoming ever more apparent globally and locally, when faced with more immediate issues - such as cost-of-living crisis, the mental health crisis, and the physical health of ourselves and our families - it can be all-too-easy to delay action for another day. Yet there is a big overlap between actions that help our planet, and actions that help our health and wellbeing; whether that's saving money and improving the health of our homes through energy efficiency, getting and staying active, or coming together to work on meaningful community projects. By focusing on this overlap, we can encourage people to take action today, and as they feel the more immediate health and wellbeing benefits, be inspired to change their behaviour even further.

Green and Healthy Frome is a pioneering project that helps to further our reputation as a town that champions community, wellbeing and sustainability, as well as one that develops innovative and ground breaking ideas.

2. The Development Phrase - Green and Healthy Future Frome

The development phase tested different ideas and ways of working, with seven initial projects:

Green Health Connectors: Green Community Connectors trained by Health Connections Mendip's Green Health Connector to talk to their communities about making healthy lifestyle choices and living in an environmentally friendly way.

Healthy Homes: A home energy advice project led by Frome Town Council in partnership with CSE and Frome Medical Practice.

Cycle Together: A free e-bike loan scheme with cycle confidence classes led by Frome Town Council.

Choosing Wisely: Exploring interventions in prescribing and lifestyle choice that lead to better climate and health outcomes, led by Frome Medical Practice.

Future Shed: Weekly sessions at Welshmill Hub to explore projects and develop initiatives related to climate and health, led by Edventure.

Storytelling: Sharing the green and healthy message across Frome and beyond through social media, press, toolkits, and a sold-out Health & Climate Conference in 2022.

Evaluation: An experienced project evaluator, based at Frome Town Council, designed a comprehensive evaluation of the project including a town-wide baseline survey on attitudes to climate and health. The evaluation work has been independently verified by Plymouth University.

3. What's Next - From Future to Now

The partnership has been awarded just under $\pounds_{1.7}$ over three years, to build on and expand the development phase of the project. We have dropped the "future" from our name as climate change is happening now, we don't have any time to wait, and the project is delivering an immediate and tangible impact on the people involved.

Our mantra for this next phase is "whole town, everyone in." We want to reach the people we haven't been able to yet, hear new voices, and encourage more people to find ways to create green and healthy outcomes with Frome. We are building a positive and inclusive movement for real change, and we invite everyone in Frome to get involved.

Our key goals are:

a. Our local community works together to enable greener, healthier lives. People are empowered to take actions that reduce carbon, improve their health and save money.

What success would look like:

> 75% of people in Frome see a strong connection between looking after their health and the planet - up from 39% in our baseline survey

- > 66% have the knowledge and motivation to seek out opportunities to benefit their health, the climate and save money
- > 50% have taken up opportunities through our partnership.
- b. Facilitate systemic change within and beyond Frome by facilitating learning and sharing our approach.

What success would look like:

- > We have an established evidence-based approach for measuring climate, health, behaviour change and cost of living co-benefits that can attract investment from across the community, NHS and local government sectors.
- > We aim to have worked with organisations within Frome and Beyond Frome, and crosssector engagement with at least 106 places across the UK, sharing our learning and contributing movement of community-led work focused on the climate, health and money co-benefit.
