For decision - Marketing and Communications Events

Summary

This report is a standing item looking at the Events element of the work of the Marketing and Communications team - it takes a look forward at the planning for the next tranche of events.

General

Upcoming events which we are supporting:

The Canteen in the Park – a shared meal to start the week

The Canteen would like to bring their relaxed, communal meal to Victoria Park on Friday 15 June 5 – 7pm. Using surplus ingredients and served on a pay-what-you-can basis, this simple outdoor gathering is all about good food, and good company. It's a chance to come together, connect, and celebrate local action in a way that feels warm, welcoming and open to all. We're supporting with logistics and providing outside event planning advice and support.

Frome Pride Parade

As reported at last Oversight Committee Frome Pride Parade has grown significantly over the last two years, and it's clear that the event had outgrown its current home at The Independent. There was talk of a stand-alone parade but in the meantime, we have facilitated Frome Pride and Frome Carnival Committee to work together to see how we can deliver a representative and inclusive Carnival and for the Carnival to use their expertise to support a stand-alone pride event next year.

Balancing the Scales

The newly formed Frome Beaver Watch have been given the rights to screen the first screening of a new Beaver Trust film, 'Balancing the Scales.' The film captures the balance between people, beavers, fish migration, and broader ecosystem health. There will be a panel hosted by Sara Butler and attended by Robert Needham from the Beaver Trust.

Pancake Race

We are still in discussions with Wixhill, the PR company working for Andros, one of our key local employers, who has brought the idea to us for a pancake race, with a desire to sponsor the event. We are still at the very beginning of the journey and are still in the process of negotiations having produced a costed budget. The hope is that Andros will cover costs, prizes and promotion, meaning we can deliver the event at minimal cost to us.

The aspiration of the event Pancake Race is to bring the community together in a new and engaging way, help to support town centre footfall, encourage positive media coverage, and build on Frome's reputation for vibrant, inclusive events and build on a budding relationship with Andros. Details such as the exact date, race route and entry process are still to be confirmed.

However, we are envisioning a short course through the marketplace, ensuring it is accessible, safe and highly visible to the public. As an entirely new event this could take up anything to between 25-40 days of staff time but is as yet, entirely undefined and it could be that we commission somebody to deliver it for us as partners.
